



Minutes as noted by Greg Compton from the July 10th Meeting at CMU

As brothers gathered some talk about the excitement of starting anew and how it all came to pass in the first place.

Members introduced selves to one another. A.J. Calkins (District Chief) invited to share views on the advisory group and his whole feelings about re-colonization.

Dave went over the whole structure of the Advisory team. Made sure everyone involved had a copy of various attributes of an advisor and what the jobs involve.

A.J. Calkins basically came in to express his own views on the re-colonization. He also appeared to express concerns about the whole advisory group in the fact that there were so few in the Mt. Pleasant area as well as the age of the Alumni who were wanting to become involved as an advisor.

Brother Steiner amidst questions asked of brother Calkins and responses from various brothers kept everyone on the agenda. E-mail was preferred by many for communication, but a few would rather receive a phone call, because they were not that connected by way of e-mail.

Went over recruitment dates and stated that brother Rae and company will set up in the back apartment, as their place for recruitment. (Recruitment Dates October 10th – October 28th) A seminar on the Recruitment schedule will be given on October 9th (CMU homecoming) from 9am until apprx. 10 or 10:30am in the University Center. A letter will go out with the next Newsletter to all alumni.

Discussion on when and where to meet for advisory team. We talked about making them around events, so that we could get a larger group. Everyone seemed in agreement. Some discussion on a side note of what we would do with members who would like to be a part of both meetings (EGHC as well). There is also the possibility that Detroit Area meetings will be held.

Talk of visits during the school year and how to communicate with the chapter. Weekly phone calls would come from the chapter counselor captains, President of the EGHC, and President of the colony. This will become a familiar routine to keep communication open between all 3 groups. Dropping in to the fraternity was encouraged, but not only to visit as an advisor, but a “brother” as well. The Counselors goal for the entire group is to hold presentations at least twice a semester anyway, and that would take care of some of the business portion of visits from Advisors.

Information was submitted by each captain. Brother Steiner brought up fund-raising and that set off a discussion of how we needed to raise some monies to support the Initiative and other retreats. It opened a discussion of the Housing Corporation having control of some major fund raising events already. This would have to be ironed out between the two groups.
