### RECOLONIZATION BEGINS THIS SUNDAY, OCTOBER 10

Beta Theta Pi Director of Expansion David Rae, *British Columbia '00*, arrives on the CMU campus this week with his team to begin the recolonization process. If you are not familiar with the process, here it is in a nutshell:

- 
1. David will host a Recolonization informational meeting for Alumni this Saturday from 9 - 10 am in the Bovee University Center. (See Above)
  2. They will begin [Recruitment Through Scholarship](#). (Scheduled from October 10th - October 20th)
  3. They will meet with all Sororities on campus and ask for their help in creating a "buzz" on campus through a philanthropy competition.
  4. An information table will be set up in the UC at 10 a.m. through 5p.m., Monday through Friday.
  5. Each evening informal recruitment events will be held.
  6. On October 18, a [Men of Principle](#) informational meeting will be held at 7:30 in the Bovee University Center.

  7. On October 20, the finalists for [Recruitment Through Scholarship](#) will be announced.
